#### **Profile of Resource Speakers**

Prof. Candida C. Agcaoili. Chairman and Discipline Consultant of the Library Science Department of UST and Chief Librarian of the same institution from 1950-1966. She was 3 times president of PLAI, the founding president and 4 times president of PATLS, director and adviser of the Phil. Asso. of Colleges and Universities – Commission on Accreditation, and a trainor/accreditor. In recognition of her many significant contributions, PLAI bestowed on her the Golden Jubilee Award in 1984 and the Hall of Fame Award in 1998.

Mr. Reuel Floreno T. Avila. Mr. Avila is the President and General Manager of Electronic Information Solutions, Inc. based in Makati City which he co-founded in the early 1990s. He is a BS Electronics and Communications Engineering graduate, cum laude, of UST, and placed 3<sup>rd</sup> in the ECE Board Exam of 1986. He was a Senior Science Research Specialist in the Phil. Council for Health Research and Development of DOST from 1986-1993 and served as resource speaker in local and international conferences.


Prof Rosalie B. Faderon. Professor Faderon is the new Dean of the UP Institute of Library and Information Science. She is a full Professor at the Institute specializing in cataloguing, indexing and abstracting and has served as College Secretary for three terms under two deans. Prof. Faderon obtained both her Foreign Service and MLS degrees from the UP.

Ms. Ana Maria B. Fresnido. Head of the Technical Services of De La Salle University, a position she holds since 1995. Her expertise in cataloging is beyond question because prior to her headship she was assistant librarian for eight years and has attended numerous seminar-workshops and trainings to continuously update herself while simultaneously serving professional associations. She finished her masters in Library Science from the University of the Philippines in 2000.

Ms. Elvira B. Lapuz. Head of the Acquisitions Section of the Main Library of UP Diliman and a Lecturer at the UP Institute of Library and Information Science (UPILIS). She obtained her BLS and MLS from the UPILIS and topped the First Librarians' Board Exam in 1992. She is a recipient of a 3-month VLIR Scholarship, sponsored by the Government of Belgium, wherein she participated in STIMULATE3 (Scientific and Technological Information Management for Universities and Libraries-An Active Training Environment 2003) held in Brussels, Belgium and a participant to the 70th IFLA World Congress held in Buenos Aires, Argentina in 2004.

Mrs. Corazon M. Nera. Director of Libraries of the Lyceum of the Philippines and Member of the Board for Librarians of the Professional Regulation Commission. . She organized the Library of the Fund for Assistance to Private Education (FAPE), the country's premier library for educators. With a subsidy from FAPE, she instituted the interlibrary loan system for schools and conceptualized the library collections development program for Filipiniana materials. She also initiated the ARALIN Project database for Filipiniana. She has served professional associations at various times as president, vice president, committee chair and member, resource speaker, lecturer and trainer, and received numerous awards from them for her work. In 2002, she was appointed as member of the Board for Librarians, a position she holds to date.

Ms. Ma. Theresa B. Villnueva. Head of the Filipiniana/Indexing Pool Section of the Rizal Library. Loyola Schools of Ateneo de Manila University. She holds a master's degree in Library Science from the UPILIS and a bachelor's degree major in Library Science from the Philippine Normal College. She was a 4- time Outstanding Performance Awardee as Librarian at ADMU and her almost 20 years experience in indexing honed her skills to this vital aspect of library work.
